King Tiger 211 - Tribute to Georg Hantusch by Jason Askew

Jason Askew (Art 1984) was born in South Africa, went to the Johannesburg School of Art Ballet and Music (now The National School of the Arts), and attended the City and Guilds of London Art College, Kensington. His interest in military history started as a teenager in the history of South Africa, The Zulu and South African wars.



Jason Askew is often commissioned by many British and overseas regiments. He was also an official war artist for the Staffordshire Regiment in Iraq. Cranston Fine Arts are proud to be publishing a majority of art prints by Jason Askew since 2005. Included is a series of four Battle of Waterloo and four Zulu War limited editions.



Ryan Greenwood (Music 2012) is the drummer for rock band, Burning Blue, who has won the 16th Annual Emerging Sounds Challenge (sponsored by TOMS, Sandton) which took place on Saturday 1 December 2012.

The band competed against 14 finalists out of a total of 150 bands. They were up against bands such as Shortstraw, Working Class Royalty and After Robot. Considering that three of the band members are 22 years old and Ryan is only 18 – it's quite an achievement!

Previous winners of this competition are Seether, The Parlotones, Prime Circle, Freshly Ground, The Finkelsteins, Pestroy, Saving Silence and Taxi Violence, to name a few.

100 Painters of Tomorrow is an open-call web submission for the most promising emerging painters that will culminate in a lavishly illustrated publication from leading art publishers Thames & Hudson which is set for publication in 2014.

A stellar jury will be judging the artists' submissions, including the painter Cecily Brown and curator-critics Tony Godfrey, Barry Schwabsky, Sir Norman Rosenthal and Yuko Hasegawa. 

Korean born pianist So Myung (**Sonia Hwang - Music 1996**) began playing piano at age seven. Her family immigrated to South Africa, where she continued her music education at the National School of the Arts. She made her debut at age sixteen with the National Symphony Orchestra (Johannesburg), performing Dohnanyi's Variations on a Nursery Song.

The Star Newspaper hailed her as a "talented, sought-after pianist with a broad spectrum of sound." Prof. Hwang's other orchestral performances include the Johannesburg Symphony, Pro Musica, Hradec Kralove Philharmony, and Randburg City Orchestra.

In 2000 Prof. Hwang completed the bachelor's degree from the University of Pretoria, and in the same year she was the overall winner of the UNISA Overseas Scholarship Competition. In 2003, she was the third-prize winner at the Kromeriz Concerto Competition in the Czech Republic.

Prof. Hwang pursued her MAM and DMA at University of North Texas.



She is on the piano faculty of the World Mission University.

Zethu Dlomo (Drama 2006) is a South African actress best known for her starring role as young, ambitious, driven, straight-shooting police officer Alice Kunene in the SABC1 science fiction television series *Room 9*, from 2012-2013.



Zethu studied at The National School of the Arts before attending Wits University, where she graduated with a BA Degree in Drama.

Prior to her role in *Room 9* she had appeared in a few productions including the role of Baone Magasane in the television drama series *The No. 1 Ladies' Detective Agency* (2009) and the role of Dinky in the 2012 film *Fanie Fourie's Lobola*.

She also appeared in the drama series *Justice for All* and presented an educational programme on SABC2.

Dlomo has also acted in a number of theatre productions including *The Hill and You Fool*, *How Can the Sky Fall?* (both directed by James Ngcobo), *Yerm* (directed by Leila Henriques) and *Anowa*, directed by Sarah Matchett.

Getting to Know the Driving Force Behind FADA



After matriculating from what was then the Johannesburg Art, Ballet, Drama and Music School (now The National School of the Arts) in 1984, Federico Freschi studied Fine Arts at Wits, majoring in photography and printmaking. He was also particularly interested in History of Art, and began research in his fourth year into what has become a key aspect of his on-going research, namely the political iconography of public buildings. He

graduated with distinction, and went on to pursue postgraduate studies in History of Art at the University of Cape Town. He took his first steps towards an academic career and begun teaching History of Art part-time at the Universities of Cape Town and Stellenbosch, and History of Design at what was then the Cape Technikon. This was followed by his first full time appointment, at the Cape Technikon, as a Lecturer in History of Design. He left the Cape Technikon to relocate to Johannesburg, taking a three year break from academia into the world of human resources consulting, where he worked in research and development. In 2002 he was appointed at Wits University, first as a Lecturer in History of Art, and after completion of his PhD, he was promoted to Senior Lecturer and later Associate Professor. He also served for a while as the Acting Head of School of the Wits School of Arts, and subsequently as Deputy Head of School.

Federico has active relationships with professional bodies, being the ex-officio President of SAVAH (South African Visual Arts Historians), a Vice-President on the Board of CIHA (the International Committee of the History of Art), and a member of the International Committee of the College Art Association in the United States.

He left his position of Associate Professor of History of Art at Wits University at the beginning of 2012 when he was invited to take up the position of Executive Manager and Senior Curator of the Goodman Gallery in Cape Town.

“Interesting and challenging as my time at the Goodman Gallery was, I saw the position of Executive Dean at FADA as a significant opportunity to bring together my skills and experience in the service of education.”

Choices: An exhibition of paintings and sculptures by Audrey Rudnick (5 -17 November 2012) at Artspace Durban



Well known artist and sculptress, **Audrey Rudnick (Art 1976?)**, was born in Durban. She attended the JHB School of Art, Ballet, Drama and Music, now called The National School of the Arts. Audrey always knew she wanted to be an artist and her undeniable talent was noticed from an early age.

After school, Audrey travelled through Europe for six years, painting and sketching. It was while she was in Paris that she was inspired to sculpt and then to combine the mediums of painting and sculpture.

Audrey's unique design of the "pod people" reached a selective audience. Her portfolio consists out of a violinist, flautist and several ethnic women – the Masai, Zulu, Xhosa and Ndebele. This unique piece of art is created from resin and wood, and flows into a palm pod.


Jo has dressed many Hollywood celebrities, cleverly combining vintage with contemporary fashion and is renowned for her use of colour, style and texture.
