After graduating from the NSA with full colours she studied at the University of Pretoria. After two years of study she transferred her studies to the Music Conservatoire in Nice in France She graduated as the Premier Prix Laureaute. In 2009 she completed her performance diploma study at the Conservatoire National Superior in Paris.

She has played with the Johannesburg Philharmonic Orchestra, Johannesburg

Festival Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of South Africa, MIAGI Festival Orchestra, Free State Symphony Orchestra and Kwa-Zulu Natal Philharmonic Orchestra.

She has played solo performances with the Johannesburg Philharmonic Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of South Africa, KwaZulu Natal Philharmonic Orchestra, Milan Soloists, Nice Summer Festival Orchestra and at the Saint Chapelle in Paris. She has played recitals in all the major cities in South Africa, in Atlanta, Washington DC, Milan, Rome, Como, Geneva, London and Paris. She was recently shortlisted for the principal flute position of the London Philharmonic Orchestra.

The guitar has been suffering over the last few years. Enter **Dan Patlansky** (**Cont Music 2000**) and his latest album, *Wooden Thoughts*. This is an

album that will save serious music lovers from despair.

It is his first acoustic album and his sixth album over all. Patlansky is considered one of the best blues guitarists in the country with only Albert Frost as his main rival. Wooden Thoughts consists of Leonard Cohen and Bob Dylan covers, as well as his original music. It also contains his first radio friendly track.

Over a late breakfast Patlansky explains how his life has changed since the release of his previous album, 20 Stones.

The album was in the Top 10 blues albums for 2012 in the world renowned magazine, Blues Rock Review.

With Wooden Thoughts, Patlansky has outdone himself and produced a work of art that can only be created on a guitar. For some real music with great lyrics, give Wooden Thoughts a listen.

Tulsa Pittaway (Music 1992) was born on Dec 9, 1974 in Harare, Zimbabwe. His parents immigrated to South Africa while he was still an infant where he grew up and attended school. Having been born into an artistic family he was surrounded by music from a very early age and played his first club gig professionally when he was 14.

In 1988 he joined the Park Town Boys High School Cadet band as a side drummer where he received his first formal musical training with renowned world champion drummer Jeff Owen. This foundation was a cornerstone in Tulsa's musical career. A year later he moved to The National School of The Arts where he majored in orchestral percussion with piano as his second instrument. In 1992 he graduated with a distinction in percussion and went on to join the South African Army senior staff band as a drummer and percussionist where he was eventually promoted to the position of section leader

In January 2000 Tulsa joined the band Watershed, recording two full albums and touring both locally and abroad. During this time Tulsa was awarded 2 Gold and 1 Platinum Sales Awards from EMI South Africa.

Tulsa has performed with international artists such as Kim Leanne and has performed alongside artists



such as The Cranberries, David Grey, Evanescence, 3 Doors Down, Stained and Hooberstank, Snow Patrol and Oasis.

In February 2007, Tulsa joined EVOLVER who continue to promote, record and tour.

In August of 2008, Tulsa released a debut solo album titled "All You Have".





How did you become a photographer?

I think Photography has always been a part of my life. I can remember still being in diapers and my Oupa following me around with his Canon T90 and telling me how he spent years taking wedding photos in the "old" days. When I was 11 and got my first camera, a silly little "mik n drik" film camera that had me spending all my pocket money on film and getting the photos developed, being at The National School of Arts making a pin hole camera in my first lesson and then falling in love with the Darkroom process. Also being at University and having Photography as an additional subject that had me so

inspired I used to spend more time on the Photography projects than on my actual subjects.

I also modelled for a while which taught me so much about what the photographer actually wants and finally, inheriting my beloved Uncle Craig's camera, a Minolta 7xi which was the beginning of my journey to becoming a professional photographer.
